

For centuries, anyone with business before the court has heard two words called out by the bailiff or court officer. Two words that demand everyone in the courtroom to come to attention. Two words that create order amidst chaos. Those two words are **ALL RISE!**

In Accountability Courts, these two words have an even greater meaning. These simple words capture the essence of what a Drug Court does. **ALL RISE** describes how instead of imprisoning an addict, Drug Courts insert hope and support into the very lives of people who the traditional justice system says are hopeless.

Whenever one person rises out of the addiction and crime, we **ALL RISE**. When a child is reunited with clean and sober parents, we **ALL RISE**. When the intergenerational cycle of drug addiction in the family is broken and healing begins, we **ALL RISE**. Whether the charge is driving while impaired, theft, burglary or any number of other addiction-driven offenses; we **ALL RISE** when a Drug Court guides the offender past the chaos and wreckage and toward recovery.

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REQUIREMENTS

- The arrested drug offender, who has stated the desire to become drug free, has the opportunity to enter the Accountability Court Program voluntarily or under a court order.
- As a candidate for the program, a background check and personal interview are conducted to assess the offender's eligibility.
- The program is a minimum of twenty-four months depending on the participant's progress. Fees are \$1800 and can be paid weekly on a payment plan.
- The program consists of four rigorous phases. Each phase has a strict set of requirements which must be successfully completed before promotion to the next phase. Upon graduation, the criminal charges could be considered for dismissal by the Judge.
- Participants are required to appear before the judge bi-monthly for a progress report; attend two weekly treatment classes; submit to weekly random drug tests; attend community support group meetings; maintain employment; pursue a GED; pay program fees timely; and have a stable place of residency. Participants are on curfew.
- The program is intense supervision and holds all participants accountable.
